District Court Changes

In 2007 the government commenced looking at changing the Rules which govern Civil proceedings. These new Rules will see a complete revamp of the way in which Civil proceedings and therefore, debt collection, is undertaken in the District Court.

One of the purposes of the new Rules is to modernize the way in which debt collection is undertaken. It is done also to make the Rules more accessible to people who wish to undertake their own debt collection.

The process that you currently use will be completely revamped and there will be a completely new set of documents and procedures available.

CASE STUDY

Neal Electrical Ltd has an outstanding debt of \$7,600.00

The client disputes the amount and refuses to pay. She also refuses to consent to have it dealt with in the Disputes Tribunal which would be a faster result than the District Court (and cost less in court fees).

Neal Electrical Ltd foregoes \$100.00 to bring it within the Disputes Tribunal jurisdiction of \$7,500 as a matter of right, & then goes ahead and files the proceedings in the Disputes Tribunal.
