ENFORCEMENT OF A COURT ORDER

Did you know that when you have a court order against your debtor, you then have to enforce that order.

The collectIT system provides subscribers with four options to enforce that order. It is up to subscribers (creditors) to choose which option best suits their situation. The options are:

Attachment Order - the court order is "attached" to the debtors wages or salary and a set amount is paid by the debtors' employer periodically until the court order is repaid.

Distress Warrant - a court bailiff seizes goods belonging to the debtor and sells these to repay the court order unless the debt is repaid.

Bankruptcy - the High Court places the debtor into bankruptcy unless the debtor pays or enters into an arrangement satisfactory to you to repay the court order.

Liquidation - if the debtor is a company the High Court can appoint a liquidator to sell the company's assets to repay the court order unless the company repays the debt.

The collectIT system provides all these options in a step by step easy to follow guide, making it the complete A-Z in debt collection.

CASE STUDY

Morgan Transport Ltd is owed \$30,000.

It issues proceedings against the debtor by filing the necessary documentation in the District Court and serving them on the debtor.

The debtor files a defence and the matter proceeds to a defended hearing with both sides representing themselves. After the hearing the District Court Judge issues a decision.
